Kunstsilo is an award-winning, former grain silo on Odderøya in Kristiansand, Norway, that has been transformed into one of Northern Europe's most innovative powerhouses for art and cultural experiences. The museum houses the Tangen collection, the world's largest collection of Nordic modernism, and the permanent collections of Kunstsilo. In addition, there will be international digital contemporary art, temporary exhibitions, and an expanded offer with lectures, concerts, food experiences, workshops, function rooms and events.

It gets flavors, inspiration and raw materials from farm life and mixes, modernizes, and refines them in an urban environment. The restaurant builds on stories about raw material heroes or how the food is prepared, it follows old conservation methods, craft traditions and a focus on health - mixed with their own food journey, urban inspiration and a good portion of playfulness.

# June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2025 – Post-conference Guided Tour

#### **Tour Highlights:**

#### ☐ Bus Transfer.

Departure from and return to Kristiansand with stops at the Kristiansand Museum, the Canon Museum, and the coastal town of Mandal.

#### ☐ Guided tour at the Kristiansand Museum.

At the open-air museum at Kongsgård you can visit close to 40 different houses. There are older wooden buildings moved here from Kvadraturen in Kristiansand and two farmyards, one from Setesdal and one from Eiken. In addition, the public can visit an old school room from the late 19th century and Tonstadbua with painted biblical motifs and rose paint inside. On Setesdalstunet is the museum's oldest building, Nomelandsloftet, from 1585. The "mini city" shows quarters with miniature houses from old Kristiansand. Current exhibitions are displayed in the main building.

#### ☐ Guided tour at the Cannon Museum.

In great hiking terrain at Møvik outside Kristiansand lies a cannon battery from the Second World War. The cannon at Møvik is the world's second largest cannon mounted on land. The battery (Batterie Vara) was started in 1941 and, together with the gun battery in Hanstholm in Denmark, was to control shipping traffic in the Skagerrak strait controlling shipping traffic from the Baltic Sea and the Atlantic Ocean. The cannons had a range of 55 kilometers. After the war, the battery became part of the Norwegian coastal artillery, and the cannons were fired for the last time in 1957. The Kristiansand cannon museum was opened in 1993 and became part of the Vest-Agder museum in 2012.

## □ Visit and free time at the coastal town of Mandal.

Mandal is a charming small coastal town which is part of the Lindesnes Municipality. It is famous for its traditional whitewashed wood houses typical of the Southern Coast of Norway. It is considered one of the oldest towns in Southern Norway and has a grown from a 14<sup>th</sup> century trading post into a town in the 18<sup>th</sup> century fueled by growing wealth from salmon fishing and lumber trade. We will stop here for a free stroll in the town, before returning to Kristiansand.
